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<p>Course Description</p>	<p>This course makes use of digital mapping tools (ArcGIS, Fulcrum & Storymap) to develop a critical engagement with Shanghai’s shifting street food landscape. By deep mapping the city’s small snacks (xiao chi 小吃), which are sold from the tiny shops and mobile stands of the city’s streets and alleyways students will learn to critically examine the modernist narrative in which economic development and urban progress is equated with ‘cleaning up the streets’. Instead, this course will argue, Shanghai’s street life, street culture and street markets are vital to its emergence as a model of 21st century urbanism.</p>
